Cambodia Online Teaching Project

Cambodia Online Teaching Project is dedicated to serving needy students and providing educational opportunities. In order to provide targeted English oral communication courses to Cambodian students, Dream Compassioneers and a Cambodian orphanage co-organized a three-month online teaching program from mid-May to July, aiming to lay a solid foundation for Cambodian children, improve their English proficiency, and change their destiny in the long run.

In the past few weeks, local undergraduates served as volunteer teachers and held several online classes with around 20 Cambodian students from the orphanage New Future in Cambodia. The volunteer teachers encouraged local students to speak English by some funny and interactive games. This month, they also taught them some vocabulary and phrase regarding traditional festivals and workplace English. We hope that through this program, the children can improve their English proficiency and change their destiny in the long run!

REPORT ON MAY ACTIVITIES

Last month, we were honored to have Mrs. Lydia Yeung, the founder of Silver Lining Foundation Limited, as the guest speaker of the 21th regular webinar of Kids' Dreams. She shared her service experience with us under the theme of "From Silicon Valley to VALLEY".

Mrs. Yeung first played a video introducing her organization, the Silver Lining Foundation, which explained the organization's aspiration , its service experiences and the thoughts on their involvement in the foundation.

Originally, Mrs. Yeung and her family lived in Hong Kong and moved to the United States. Later kn, they were inspired by the plight of children in mountainous areas and decided to give up their comfortable life in the US in order to provide education and assistance to impoverished and disabled children in remote mountainous areas of Nanning, Guangxi. Despite the difficulties and harsh living conditions, the Yeung family spared much effort in assisting local students. They not only provided assistance in children's education, but also cared for their emotional needs, accompanying them throughout their childhood, becoming their partners, and bringing laughter and joy to their childhood.

During the talk, Mrs. Yeung's son, Josh, also shared his experience of struggling to adapt to life in Guangxi when he first arrived as a child, but gradually learning to enjoy playing with the local kids and becoming more involved with the foundation. After completing high school and university in the US, he returned to the Silver Lining Foundation to help with its work. His childhood experiences made him understand the value of service and he hopes to help more people. Over the past two decades, the Silver Lining Foundation has tirelessly provided assistance not only in Guangxi, but also in other places such as Myanmar and Vietnam. The foundation has opened schools, orphanages, rehabilitation centers, and more in mainland China and Southeast Asia, hoping to help more people in need receive appropriate assistance. The spirit of service demonstrated by the Silver Lining Foundation, Mrs. Yeung, and her family, has helped endless disabled individuals and impoverished students. Their dedication over the past decade has lit up the lives of countless people, and is worthy of learning from and appreciating.
