DREAM COMPASSIONEERS FUTURE SERVICE LEADERS DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME: F1. Life Training Camp



This year, Dream Compassioneers collaborated with Yan Chai Hospital Law Chan Chor Si College to organize the Future Service Leaders Development Program (F1 Life Training Camp), a two-day camp for Form 1 students. The aims of the camp were to facilitate mutual understanding among the Form 1 students, foster interpersonal relationships, establish peer support networks, strengthen class cohesion, and cultivate future service leaders who contribute to society. Two successful camps have already been held this month, incorporating various service experiential activities such as visual impairment simulation, environmental protection sharing, wheelchair experiences, and a banquet symbolizing socio-economic disparities. This year's training will span eight weeks, with over a hundred Form 1 students participating. These activities aimed to cultivate the students' spirit of service and develop them into future servant leaders. We look forward to the next camp, where more students can experience the joy of service!


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Chloe -- **President**
