

Read To Inspire

Last month, we were very pleased to invite Mr. Kent Lucas, a volunteer from Paws Guardian Rescue Shelter, to be the speaker of the 28th regular online talk "Passion to Talk, Talk to Inspire". Mr. Lucas share with us the current problem of animal abandonment and straying in Hong Kong. Mr. Lucas said that the current statistics of stray animals in Hong Kong are insufficient, and the method of humane destruction has not been able to effectively address the problem of stray animals, resulting in many stray animals losing their lives because they could not wait for their owners to claim them. At the same time, Mr. Lucas also proposed the concept of TNR, that is, Trap, Neuter, and Return. In addition to TNR, the volunteers of Paws Guardian Rescue Shelter also hope to achieve the ultimate goal of Rehome, so that stray animals can find a new home.

Mr. Lucas believes that Hong Kong can learn more from other countries' methods for dealing with stray animals, such as promoting an adoption culture, setting up more pet shelters and introducing animal-friendly policies, etc., to reduce the number of stray animals. Mr. Lucas believes that the government should take the lead in taking actions, such as changing animal laws and promoting animal conservation, to draw public attention to stray animals. Moreover, Mr. Lucas pointed out that the recent holding of pet adoption days and the addition of pet-friendly measures can increase public

tolerance and concern for stray animals.

Mr. Lucas shared that the main difficulty is the lack of housing space. During the rescue process, animals need time to recover and adjust their previous personalities, resulting in a relatively long waiting time for stray animals to be adopted. We hope that Paws Guardian Rescue Shelter can save the lives of more stray animals in the future, and we also hope that this sharing will make participants pay more attention to the problem of stray animals!

On August 25, Happify, the first group of HKSSLA, successfully held "Brain Playground for Young Learners" at St. Paul's College, a children's fun day with the aim of providing quality play time for those from underprivileged families.

The event featured a variety of team-based brain games, allowing participants to think critically, communicate effectively, and collaborate while enjoying themselves and fostering stronger interrelationships with their parents.

Group 1 kickstarted the day with a series of icebreaking games designed to enhance team cohesion. "Building Your Personality Island" sparked cooperation and creativity as the children worked together to construct the tallest tower using given materials.



After lunch, the excitement was in full swing during the "Battle for the Control Center". Children took on the role of strategic masterminds, analysing each other's tactics while directing pieces on a simulated battlefield.

The highlight of the day was "Reconstruction of Self-Awareness", where children engaged in various team games to capture stations and claim land. As the game progressed, they fostered open communication, collaborated on strategies, and cheered on one another, strengthening their teamwork skills.

As the day came to a close, student leaders reflected on the joyful moments we had created. Not only were

the childrenen couraged to voice their thoughts, but the student leaders also inspired them to recognise the importance of positive communication and teamwork. This laid a solid foundation for the development of a healthy mentality, together with a fierce boost in self-confidence.

Luminance is dedicated to promoting community inclusion and helping children, which is why group 2's service programs cover various groups of children, including those with special educational needs, ethnic minority children, new immigrant children, and children from low-income families.

In August, group 2 students held the "Exploring Talents Together with You" event at the Hung Shui Kiu Youth S.P.O.T, targeting a group of children with attention deficit/hyperactivity disorder (ADHD).





Group 2 students created diverse games for children with special educational needs, such as drawing guessing games, nursery rhyme ensembles, and sports activities, allowing them to learn collaboration and discover their talents. Group 2 students understand that children with special educational needs face numerous challenges in their growth journey, but they hope to lend them a helping hand, making them feel accepted and loved through companionship and communication.

Every child has their own unique strengths, and student leaders are committed to uncovering their talents. Subsequently, they will launch other services, such as enhancing ethnic minority children's understanding of Chinese culture, reducing the adjustment difficulties faced by new immigrant children, and providing workshops for children from low-income families.

Following the workshop, participants were divided into two service teams based on their preferences: interacting with wheelchair users and engaged in activities about the visually impaired. In the first service activity, participants played games and friendly matches with wheelchair users. Everyone was highly engaged and enjoyed the experience. During the time, wheelchair users shared their skills and provided guidance, helping participants to familiarise with wheelchair use. At the end of the activity, everyone expressed their feelings and reflections on the experience.

In the second service activity, children crafted handmade lanterns for the Mid-Autumn Festival, which student leaders later gifted to wheelchair users. After completing the lanterns, participants donned blindfolds and undertook various challenges to better understand the difficulties faced by visually impaired individuals. This exercise aimed to encourage empathy and inspire participants to offer assistance in real life. Overall, the activity sought to convey care and concern through meaningful interactions between participants and individuals with disabilities.

In mid to late August, Elpis organized the "童 路有您" service. This service comprised two main components: a volunteer training workshop and a service activity. The training workshop took place at the Hong Kong Playground Association's Choi Tak Integrated Youth Service Centre, participants engaged in various activities such as wheelchair simulations, Q&A games, experiences of visual impairment, and Braille exercises. These activities focused on raising awareness about the challenges faced by individuals with disabilities and fostering a deeper understanding of their needs, encouraging participants to be more mindful and supportive in their daily lives.





The 4th Dream Compassioneers Debate Competition

The 4th Dream Compassioneers Debate Competition successfully held its quarterfinals and semifinals on July 14th. We are grateful to the City University of Hong Kong for providing the venue for the event. The competition results have been announced on the Instagram of Dream Compassioneers. The topics for this round of the competition included whether the Hong Kong government should mandate students to participate in social service, such as "The direct subsidy school scheme in Hong Kong is more beneficial than detrimental to students' growth" and "To address the issue of school bullying, laws are more important than education.". We hope to guide students to reflect on the impact of education on the growth of students.

We believe that after the competition, participating students will have a deeper understanding of issues related to children and service learning, thereby initiating social advocacy efforts. We extend our gratitude to Bishop Hall Jubilee School, Yan Chai Hospital Law Chan Chor Si College, HKMLC Queen Maud Secondary School and St. Paul Convent School for their support as co-organizing schools, providing staff and judges.

Additionally, we sincerely thank all the judges for taking the time out of their busy schedules to attend and judge the competition, and we believe that the students have benefited greatly. We also appreciate the active participation and support from various schools in the 4th Dream Compassioneers Debate Competition.

The finals of the 4th Dream Compassioneers will be held in October. Let us all look forward to the exciting performances of the two strong teams as they compete for the ultimate victory!
